Braille is a language that stimulates the imaginations of many. This wonderful language was demonstrated to our students. Two of the students of the blind school did a reading as well as a writing, in Marathi, in Braille. The experience left everyone present, dumbstruck.

People are gifted with eyes of diverse colours- some green, some blue, some black and some with a tinge of brown, which reveals the zest and ambition of a person. But one must exercise caution with the above. If one can predict ambitions through the eyes, can one fathom the storehouse of ambition in these children?
