**A BRIEF REPORT.**

On the 10th of September 2012, the students of The Bishop's Co- Ed School Kalyaninagar, were privileged to have in their midst, Sir Robert Swan, the first man ever to have conducted expeditions to the two poles of the Earth. A great leader and representative of the environmental concerns of the planet, Sir Robert Swan's visit aimed at instilling in students, the need for the conservation of their surroundings, and at large, the global environment.

This visit, was an initiative taken by TERI (The Energy and Resources Institute), to educate the children. Sir Robert swan in his eloquent speech gave us a detailed account of his childhood dream to walk to the two poles, and his ultimate success, making him the first man ever to have achieved this feat. We learnt that hard work and determination are the only ways to achieve your dreams and we must never yield to the imposing difficulties that appear to hinder our progress.

It was a proud moment for our school, when Sir Robert Swan, praised the effort of the school, in collecting the largest number of 'tetra-packs' in Pune and for our active participation in the preservation of our surroundings.

The Teachers and participating students then set off on their trip to the New English School Tilak road for the T.R.A.S.H festival organized by TERI. Several schools from Pune also participated in various competitions like T-shirt painting, Paper Jeweling, Trasholi and Toy Making. We also met students who were part of the national film-making contest as part of project SEARCH and had qualified into the top 29. All the competitions were closely contested by the participating schools. At the prize distribution ceremony, our school proudly walked away with the Trasholi prize. Arjun Nair's video won him a nomination into the top 29 students from the country and earned him the title of Tetra-pak ambassador, Pune. All 29 tetra pak ambassadors had the privilege of an exclusive interaction with Sir Robert Swan. After gauging the background and passion of all the tetra- pak ambassadors from the various top schools in the country, Arjun Nair from the Bishop's school was awarded the second prize at the national level for his video entry entitled "TETRA PAK RECYCLING IS FUN" and 'SAVE ANTARTICA'.
