
CAMPUS VISIT TO MIT-WORLD PEACE UNIVERSITY

On the day of the visit, students first assembled on the grounds of Junior College, attending their first class of the day before piling into buses, separated streamwise,




playing music and talking animatedly on their hour-long journey to the campus, located in the Kothrud Area of Pune.
